Private Law Children



Notable Public Law Children cases

- Re Y (A Minor) (No 2) (Brussels II Revised: Jurisdiction after Article 15 Transfer: Welfare) [2022] EWFC 69 Annie successfully represented the child in circumstances where the Guardian recommended continued placement with the child's foster carers under a Special Guardianship Order against an application for placement with a family member in Hungary; and a Specific Issue Order to change the child's surname.
